#### 2012 in Review

I don't know that a DNA test could prove it, but I believe I am 3/4ths nerd. What that means is that I love this time of year when we summarize our data. I find a pie chart to be exhilarating!

Numbers are one of the ways we can tell our story.

As we go into our 10<sup>th</sup> year of service, the numbers tell a story of slow, steady growth. In fact, my best estimate is that in the last 10 years volunteer mission teams have provided over 17,000 visits to patients! We'll have a special addition of our annual report in May which will celebrate our 10 years.

Now, let's take a look at 2012:

- **▼** 714 volunteers donated 11,994 hours of service to care for patients.
- ◆ 3,157 visits were provided to 2,862 patients during the year at clinics sponsored by 11 mission team sponsors.
- ♥ 94% of our patients did not have insurance.
- **▼** 38% of our patients are employed, 62% are unemployed.
- **▼** 71% of our patients have household incomes of less than \$16,000 a year.
- ▼ If they had not been able to visit Clinic with a Heart, 43% of our patients said they would likely have gotten their care in the emergency room.
- ♥ 81% of the patients we saw were between the ages of 18 to 65 years old. 12% were under the age of 18.
- ▼ 74% of our patients spoke English as their primary language. 15% spoke Spanish.
  Patients spoke over 20 other languages. 6% of our patients could not speak English at all.

◆ A conservative estimate is that for every dollar donated to Clinic with a Heart there was a return on investment of 588%. This includes replacement care costs and the community savings achieved by reducing visits to the emergency department.

#### **Oral Health and Overall Health**

From the Oral Cancer Foundation, "Approximately 42,000 Americans will be newly diagnosed with oral cancer in 2013. When found early oral cancers have an 80% survival rate. Unfortunately the majority are found as late stage cancers, and this accounts for the very high death rate of about 45% at five years from diagnosis. It doesn't have to be this way. Regular dental visits are the first line of defense though the process of early discovery."

The first Dental clinic of the new-year at Clinic with a Heart was a pretty regular evening when we saw 16 patients. We referred to the appropriate places as we usually do. That evening two of the patients came in with pain emanating from lesions on the tongue. The patients were examined at the clinic by the Dentists on duty. He found each of the lesions involved the border of the tongue and were determined by the dentists to need attention soon by an oral pathologist. Clinic with a Heart does not have a regular way to deal with this referral but has a great relationship with the University of Nebraska College of Dentistry. There, the oral pathologist agreed to see both patients. It was determined that both had Stage IV oral cancer. Both are in the process of getting treatment.

This is just one of the unique opportunities our volunteers provide to those in need. The profound impact of finding serious dental conditions in our own backyard to help those in need really does

happen. It is truly a blessing to these patients and rewarding to our dental community to have all the volunteers of Clinic with a Heart each and every clinic night. – Roger Fisher, All Smiles Dentistry, Clinic with a Heart Dental Director
